* The term "Tax Freedom Day," was coined and popularized by the nonpartisan, Washington, D.C. -based Tax Foundation. As the Tax Foundation has explained, it is "the day when Americans . . . finally have earned enough money to pay off their total [federal, state and local] tax bill for the year." (For simplicity's sake, the Tax Foundation assumes an equal amount of income is earned every day, and does not distinguish weekdays from weekends.)

Since Indiana and Michigan became Right to Work states in early 2012 and early 2013, respectively, they are counted as forced-unionism states for all analyses featuring data no more recent than 2011. Indiana is excluded from multi-year analyses including 2012 data, while Michigan is counted as a forced-unionism state. For analyses covering 2012 alone, Indiana is counted as a Right to Work state, and Michigan is counted as a forced-unionism state.
