## **House Panel Leaders Seek Case Data, Ballots In Review of NLRB Lamons Gasket Decision**

The board decided Aug. 26 in Lamons Gasket Co. to overrule a four-year-old precedent, Dana Corp., that allowed employees 45 days to challenge an employer's voluntary recognition of a labor union by filing a decertification petition. Under the new ruling, the board held that the filing of a representation election petition is barred for a reasonable period of time following voluntary recognition of a union designated by a majority of employees.
